Explained that this can be linked to family.</p> <p>Scenarios with answers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Embarrassed about no money to buy uniform – tell someone at school, we can help and we can give you some!• If I tell you a secret, please don't tell anyone else – explained that we cannot keep things secret. We have a duty of care to you to make sure that things get better.• Sometimes my mum makes me stay off school when I am not poorly and I end up alone – speak to someone and let us know. We need to

Come to school and speak to us.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can I watch 18 films or play games that are over 18? We need to make sure that you only watch things for your age, they have games for adults and games for children. Use the children ones only. • My mum and dad are arguing all the time and I am getting upset, who can I talk to? You can speak to a member of your family or someone in school. We can make it easier for you and help your parents too. • Someone is at school calling me names and pushing me around when nobody is looking, what can I do? Speak with parents or speak with adults in school. Find help and talk to them – we can make it better! Don't live with it! We need to stop it! Try not to react to them. • I am hungry when I come to school because we don't have any food. We can help to feed you and get support for your family too. • Some people are calling me names and are being racist by talking about the colour of my skin.
