The impact of the funding

The sports premium funding has enabled 2016-17 to be a successful year at Hartley Brook. The funding has enabled the specialised PE teacher and sports coach to purchase specialised sports equipment to deliver a broad and balanced curriculum. The impact in PE lessons is that by using the equipment we have begun to embed the important physical literacy skills essential for success and progress in PE. This has resulted in over 90% of children in Y2-5 and 86% of Y6 children having reached their age related milestones this year with between 25-30% exceeding expectations.

The funding has enabled us to buy into the Arches school sports partnership which provides specialised coaching, staff C.P.D and further opportunities and competitions for our children. The impact of this is that we have introduced new clubs, and have seen an increase in the number of children participating in clubs and competitions due to an extensive competition calendar provided by the Arches school sports partnership. In addition to this we have also hired in coaches from Sheffield United Football Club and the Sky Try Rugby initiative. These have provided our children with further specialised coaching to enhance their skills. The impact of this as well as increased staff confidence while teaching P.E has seen our children perform well at competitions - narrowly missing out on several Sheffield

schools city finals. The sport premium funding has allowed us to pay for transport to attend the competitions. As a result of our improved success in competitions and good practice in lessons this year we were awarded the Arches Primary School of the Year Award at their annual sports awards evening for our area of the city.

The sports premium has allowed us to continue to raise the profile of PE in school and in July we held our first sports awards evening celebrating the efforts of our children in lessons, clubs and competitions. The funding allowed us to purchase major trophies, and individual medals for all children who were invited to attend. The extracurricular clubs we have offered this year have had a positive effect on lots of pupils to encourage them to engage in regular physical activity working towards the recommended 30 mins a day in school. The funding has allowed us to run the following extra-curricular programme by purchasing equipment, providing specialised coaching and staff training.

During 2016-17 Hartley Brook provided over 20 extra-curricular sports clubs per week for the children. These included

- 5 breakfast clubs per week – including change 4 life clubs- targeting specific pupils.
- Up to 8 lunchtime clubs per week – including “green zone” reward clubs where children can drop in on a particular day if nominated by their teacher for good classroom work
- Up to 6 after school clubs per week between 3pm-4pm

The activities on offer changed each half term to allow different sports/activities and year groups to be targeted.

Competitions

We have entered lots of competitions and festivals and have used some of the funding for transport to enable us to compete. We have been really successful this year –some of our achievements to date

In addition to these we also have Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 Football teams both boys and girls who regularly play fixtures in leagues. The funding has been used to purchase equipment to allow the teams to train.

Sports Day

We held successful KS1 and KS2 sports days on site and the funding allowed us to purchase traditional sports day equipment to allow a mixture of competitive and participation activities. The impact of this allowed all children success in a competitive environment and raised the profile of the school. After consultation with many parents we have decided to hold Ks2 sports day next year at the English Institute of Sport in Sheffield.
