Free School Meals

Pupils who are currently in Year 2 have universal free school meals. However, in September when pupils move up to Year

3 universal free school meals are no longer available. Please ensure that you apply for income related free school meals as soon as possible in readiness for September. If you have income related free school meals then pupils will still be eligible for free school meals otherwise school lunches will need to be paid for. Forms are available in the school office, or we can check for you, we just need national insurance number and date of birth. If you need any help, please contact the school office.

Attendance Updates:

If your child is classed as a persistently absence pupil, with an attendance percentage of 90% and below, school will no longer be authorising any further absence. This is in line with the expectations set for schools by the Local Authority.
